Uncovering Hidden Strengths

BHITC works to uncover and platform resident leaders who are passionate about a specific kind of change occurring in their community.

Building Resident Leadership Capacity

We walk with residents (before, during and after Rally CLE), pre- paring for their project and developing their leadership & advocacy capacity.





Initiating Community Partnerships

We connect residents to resources, organizations, and churches in their community to help enrich their project, while also creating a more connected and interdependent community.

Developing Urban/Suburban Relationships

We encourage a relationship between your church and the group of residents you'll be working with as you prepare and plan, which will hopefully transcend the Rally CLE process.

Cultivating an Asset-Based Posture

We intentionally place community members and their desires/ideas at the center of the Rally CLE process so that churches can be available to listen and learn from their experiences in these neighborhoods.

Your Part to Play in the Rally CLE Process

sponsorship

Residents can be awarded up to \$2,000 of grant funding through Rally CLE to fuel their project. Your church's sponsorship of grant funds will go directly to those grants, which will provide materials, tools, food, and whatever else is needed to implement each project. We're hoping to fund 12-15 projects across the community in 2024.

Past projects have included:

- Block parties to build community between neighbors
- Storytelling and oral history initiatives with long-time neighbors
- Community garden installations or improvements
- · Murals and public art projects
- Public park installations or improvements
- Cooking classes/art classes for youth in the neighborhood
- Greenspace or alley clean-ups/beautification

site coordinators

After you decide to sponsor a project, your church's next step will be identifying a site coordinator who will spend time getting to know the resident leader your church will be working with, helping them prepare/plan for their project, and provide leadership for the church team you prepare to send.

Deadline for Site Coordinator Identification: Sunday, July 21st

teams

Typically, we ask teams to consider sending anywhere from 10-25 people, but what we ask of your church will be based on 1) your churches capacity, 2) your level of sponsorship, and 3) the scope of the project we'll connect you to.
